Signs of Opioid Overdose

Misuse of opioids like Vicodin®, (hydrocodone), OxyContin®, Percocet® (oxycodone) and heroin can lead to overdose. During overdose, breathing slows or stops and can result in death.

Call 911 right away and follow the dispatcher's instructions if someone has any of these symptoms:

- face is extremely pale and/or feels clammy to the touch
- body goes limp
- fingernails have a blue or purple color
- vomiting or making gurgling noises
- cannot be awakened or is not able to speak
- breathing or heartbeat slows or stops

If you see someone overdose, call 911 right away.

Narcan (Naloxone)

Narcan (naloxone) is a drug given to quickly reverse an overdose from opioids and restore breathing.
People who are at risk of overdose or their family members should have Narcan in case of accidental overdose. Naloxone is available at most pharmacies without a prescription, and often covered by insurance.

NC 911 Good Samaritan Law

North Carolina's 911 Good Samaritan Law states that people who have a drug overdose or people who see someone overdose and get help for them can no longer be prosecuted for possession of small amounts of drugs, paraphernalia or under-age drinking.
